The Lord's Own Prayer

I have had the privilege of spending time with members of the ancient Syriac Orthodox Church, who worship in a version of Aramaic, the everyday language that Christ spoke. It was always an exciting moment when they prayed the Lord's Prayer, in the language used by Christ, as He taught his disciples how to pray. It was a dramatic reminder that we can only call it the Lord's Prayer, because it comes directly from Our Lord Jesus Christ. The Lord's Prayer offers a model for all forms of prayer, but it is also there for us to use, when we need the structure of a set form. The Lord's Prayer is the Lord's gift to us, so we can be confident that it serves as a working pattern into the life of God.
