Across the diocese... A letter from Bishop Tricia....Candle in the Window

Dear friends,

On Tuesday 27th January at 8pm I will be lighting a candle and placing it in a window in commemoration of Holocaust Memorial Day. I warmly invite you and every member of our church family to join me by lighting your own candle in a wave of light 'Candle in the Window'.

I am pleased that this act has been developed in partnership with Carol Jempson (a key organiser of the Island's annual Holocaust Memorial Day Service) and has the support of the Chief Minister and Lieutenant Governor.

Candle in the Window is a simple, shared act of remembrance, creating a moment of reflection and unity. This candle lighting will take place in the evening of Holocaust Memorial Day, which marks the anniversary of the liberation of the Auschwitz-Birkenau concentration camp in 1945.

The aim is to remember the six million Jewish people murdered in the Holocaust, the millions of other victims of Nazi persecution, including Roma and Sinti people, disabled people, LGBTQ+ people, political opponents and others targeted by the regime along with the many millions brutally targeted by campaigns of hatred in the decades since. Equal and deliberate space is given to honour the victims of all genocides, past and present.

We hope that by lighting a candle at the same time, individuals, families and communities might come together in quiet solidarity to remember every life and to reaffirm our commitment to standing against hatred in all its forms and to strengthening our shared life.
