MT16: House Martin	*St Patricks, Jurby ONLY* Churches nearest to where they have previously been sighted	MWT Manx Birdlife	
MT17: Yellow Rattle		MWT	A good choice for churches, with areas of grass, who want to increase the diversity of wildflowers at their church.
MT18: Spotted Flycatcher		MWT Manx Birdlife	Rural churches with mature trees and patches of sun. Spotted Flycatchers prefer more open canopies that allow insects to gather between the trees.

MT20: Stoat		MWT	Sadly, records of Manx stoats is limited, but you find them in habitats with Manx stone walls and hedgerows. They also like areas of scrub and long grass.
MT21: Oak		MWT Woodland trust	A church with neighbouring woodland or space to plant trees
MT22: Swift	Urban churches	MWT Manx Birdlife	Urban churches are more likely to be near to where Swifts are nesting.
MT23: Barn Owl	St Jude's Church Kirk Andreas Church Bride Church	MWT Manx Birdlife	Is your churchyard located near to open rough grassland? Barn owls are particularly found in the north around the Northern Plain.
MT24: Hedgehog		MWT MHCG	If you have a hedgerow or a boundary where there is potential to plant a hedgerow.
MT25: Tree Sparrow	St Peter's Church – Cregneash Arbory Church - Ballabeg Kirk Malew Church Churches nearest to where they have previously been sighted.	MWT Manx Birdlife	The most threatened bird on the Isle of Man, this species is a bird of farmland edges, especially arable land.
