*Sunday 21st June - Service for Prison Sunday at Jurby Church at 2pm, followed by delicious refreshments, this service aims to encourage prayer and awareness of the needs of prisoners and their families, of victims of offenders, prison staff and all those who care. It is open to all across the Diocese and you are encouraged to share in it and to show your support. Come and be inspired by the words of Jesus who said 'When I was in prison you visited me'

*Isle of Man Friends of the Earth invite You to a screening of the new film *The People's Emergency Briefing* on Tuesday 23rd at 6.30pm refreshments, for a 7pm start at St Thomas' Church Finch Road, Douglas. This is an eye-opening yet hopeful look at the latest in the climate and nature crisis and its impacts on us and what should be done about it according to leading UK scientists and experts. The film is based on the National Emergency Briefing in Westminster as covered by ITV, C4 and The Times. It will be introduced by Adrian Cowin, former Senior Isle of Man Meteorologist and followed by an opportunity to hear what people on island are doing in response to the crisis. It's free, no need to book, bring a friend or neighbour.

*Saturday 4th July there will be a Manx Bible Translators' Trail 'pilgrimage' visiting the parishes to hear parts of the Scriptures which were translated there – in English and Manx. We start at 10am at St Matthews and aim to finish around 4.30 pm at St Johns, walking along the level Heritage Trail. It's 8 miles in all but you can join and leave wherever you wish – no need to book! Bring drinks and a bite to eat if you'll be with us at lunchtime which will be at Marown Vicarage. At 4 pm all are welcome to join us at St Johns Methodist chapel where the Bible Society's new bilingual edition of the Gospel of Luke will be launched.
