Across the Diocese

*Pilgrimage is one of the main areas in the Faith in the North initiative led by the Archbishop of York. Starting this coming Friday (25th September), he accompanies Bishop Tricia on a 25-mile trek around parts of the island. We are invited to join them at St Peter's Cregneash at 4pm for Evening Prayer. Saturday celebrates 10yrs of the Triskelion Way and they will include Glen Wyllin

and Spooyt Vane. In the afternoon, they walk from Ramsey to Maughold concluding with Evening Prayer at 6pm in Maughold Church and an opportunity to renew baptismal vows using water from the ancient well of St Maughold.

***Fairtrade Fortnight runs from 21st Sept – 4th Oct with a theme of “Responding to issues of Injustice”. There will be a film screening of ‘Dark Waters’ (Cert 12) at Dalby Schoolrooms 7.00pm for 7.30pm start on Fri 25th of Sept: it is inspired by the true story of a tenacious attorney who uncovers a dark secret that connects a growing number of deaths to one of the world’s largest corporations. In the process he risks everything to expose the truth.**

There will also be a Fairtrade introduction, update, products and refreshments: Free Admission & FT Refreshments; no need to book in advance. Donations after costs to the Fairtrade Foundation working to help poor farmers across the world sell their products at Fair price details.
